






WELCOME TO CANTERBURY

GETTING AROUND

BY CAR

New homes in Canterbury benefit from superb road and rail links to nearby towns and cities. The A2 road connects the city to London, beginning at Borough in the capital and stretching for over 72 miles.

BY BUS

Travelling around Canterbury is easy thanks to its convenient bus services, which link to neighbouring towns such as Herne Bay, Whitstable and Chartham.

BY RAIL

The city has two railway stations, Canterbury West and Canterbury East. From Canterbury West, you can catch a high-speed train which will get you to London St Pancras International in just 57 minutes. You can also travel directly to other locations in Kent, such as Gillingham, Faversham and Rochester.



BEANY HOUSE OF ARTS & KNOWLEDGE

Right in the heart of Canterbury you'll find this museum, library and art gallery, perfect for art lovers.

GREEN SPACES

Saxon Fields is surrounded by rolling countryside and mature woodland, with the Kent Downs Area of Oustanding Beauty just a short drive away. You can also look forward to escaping the buzz of the city with a relaxing stroll through one of the beautiful parks and scenic walks.

GREAT STOUR WAY

Popular with cyclists, runners and dog walkers, this three mile trail is a great way to spot local wildlife.

DANE JOHN GARDENS

This historic park has a cafe to enjoy as you take in the stunning views across the city.

RSPB BLEAN WOODS

This National Nature Reserve covers 1,257 acres of ancient woodlands, high forest and heath to explore.

WESTGATE GARDENS

These landscaped public gardens overlook the River Stour and is a perfect spot to take in the history and fresh air.





LOCAL TO CANTERBURY

Just a couple of miles south-west of Canterbury is Thanington, using the Old English word *ing* meaning *farmstead or village*. Thanington dates back to 12th Century and borders the River Stour.

Outside of the bustling city centre there is plenty to see and do, with the location perfect for outdoor adventure and recreational activities.



TRENLEY PARK HORSE RIDING

World-renowned riding club serving local, national and international clients. The stable opened in 2000, and offers Livery and horse riding services.

STODMARSH NATURE RESERVE

A unique area of natural beauty, take a walk or cycle in the great outdoors and experience a rich variety of wildlife.

The area includes wetland, reedbeds, lakes and woodland walks with over six kilometres of footpaths. There are also sensory trails and popular bird-watching spots.



HOWLETTS WILD ANIMAL PARK

Take a visit and support this animal conservation charity and directly protect endangered species through captive breeding, education and reintroduction.



Based on the north Kent coast, this Sailing Club was formed in 1962 and is an accredited RYA Training Centre. The club has an active programme from March to November, and welcomes new sailing and social members.


